Standards, Section II

Forms C and D are used to evaluate the NFP teacher. The purpose of these forms is to evaluate the NFP teacher according to Section II of the Standards for NFP Ministry. This process gives both the diocesan NFP coordinator and the teacher a means to assess the teacher's capabilities, discover strengths, and acknowledge areas that need development.

Form D is for the evaluation of the NFP teacher in a teaching setting. The diocesan NFP coordinator schedules the observation utilizing an appropriate number of couple/client contact sessions in order to complete the evaluation; therefore, Form D can be used to document several dates of observation. The completed Form D should be kept in the diocesan NFP files.

The observation should be done by an experienced NFP teacher. If the diocesan NFP coordinator is not an NFP teacher, a teacher/supervisor should be appointed by the coordinator to conduct the evaluation. At the conclusion of observation, the teacher receives a copy of the completed form and is given the opportunity to record his/her comments as an attachment to the form.

Upon completion of the observation, a review meeting should be scheduled by the person who conducted the observation with the NFP teacher. The meeting should include the diocesan NFP coordinator if that person did not conduct the observation.
