The NRRO Adapts to Growing Demand for Virtual Educational Content

The NRRO understands the importance of meeting religious institutes' needs in innovative ways. Last summer, we conducted an education-focused survey that revealed the growing demand for virtual educational content. This discovery led us to develop a new video series that offers a framework for religious institutes to begin retirement planning.

The Importance of Comprehensive Retirement Planning for Religious Institutes

Planning for retirement is a critical issue for religious institutes because they are responsible for caring for their elderly members. Institutes need to plan ahead to take care of retired members' physical, spiritual, psychosocial and financial needs. Recognizing this need, the NRRO is pleased to offer a free video series, Basic Elements of a Comprehensive Retirement Plan, that covers broad topics to help institutes ask the right questions.

The series comprises five brief sessions, each presented by an expert in its respective subject matter. The videos are relevant to everyone in religious institutes, from leadership to members to the staff of care facilities.

Our goal with this series is to provide essential information as a starting point for communities in the early stages of retirement planning. We also aim to refresh the efforts of institutions that have already begun retirement planning. The starting points that we present can benefit institutes with both younger and older age cohorts. The material covered in these presentations is relevant to religious institutes of all types—women and men, large and small, apostolic or monastic.
