What are the CSMG District Visits?

CSMG District Visits provide a way for Catholic social ministry leaders returning from CSMG to connect the efforts of national colleagues with the local voice of partner organizations, parishioners, and dedicated volunteers. Follow-up visits after CSMG with U.S. Senators and Representatives, or their staffs, in their district offices will bring local experience and energy to bear on CSMG 2012's legislative priorities:

- Protecting assistance for poor and vulnerable families in the U.S.
- Protecting poverty-focused international assistance.

An ideal time to conduct these visits is when Congress is in recess and members are in their home districts, such as the week of February 20th. District Visits will be most effective if completed before the end of April 2012.

Why Should I Participate in a CSMG District Visit?

The CSMG District Visits aim to launch a vision and build a community for collaborative local action in Catholic social ministry throughout the year. They are also an exercise of religious liberty and constructive civic engagement as a faith community at a time when it is more important than ever. Who is Organizing a CSMG District Visit in my Area?

In consultation with the CSMG Hill Visits Committee, District Visits may be organized by CSMG state captains, diocesan staff members, or by members of CSMG partners' regional networks. A designated District Visit organizer will schedule meetings with U.S. Senators' and Representatives' district offices (a total of three meetings).

District Visits should be scheduled well in advance. Local teams should also meet at least once before their visits, so they can review the issues, and decide on each team member's role during and after the meeting.
