- [Racism and Migration | en Español](#) – Reflects on how racism influences immigration policy and public attitudes toward migrants and refugees. It urges Catholics to welcome the stranger and defend human dignity.
- [Racism and the Criminal Justice System | en Español](#) – Discusses racial disparities in policing, sentencing, and incarceration. It calls for restorative justice and reform rooted in mercy and human dignity.
