INTRODUCTION

Each year the Secretariat of Divine Worship of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops publishes the *Liturgical Calendar for the Dioceses of the United States of America*. This calendar is used by authors of *ordines* and other liturgical aids published to foster the celebration of the liturgy in our country.

The calendar is based upon the General Roman Calendar, promulgated by Pope Saint Paul VI on February 14, 1969, subsequently amended by the Holy See, and the Proper Calendar for the Dioceses of the United States of America, approved by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.¹ This calendar has been updated to reflect the names and titles of the various liturgical days in conformity with the *Roman Missal, Third Edition*.

The *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* reminds us that in the cycles of readings and prayers proclaimed throughout the year in the sacred liturgy “the mysteries of redemption are celebrated so as to be in some way made present.” Thus may each celebration of the Holy Eucharist which is served by this calendar be for the Church in the United States of America “the high point both of the action by which God sanctifies the world in Christ and of the worship that the human race offers to the Father, adoring him through Christ, the Son of God, in the Holy Spirit.”²

The cycles given above have been used in the preparation of this Calendar. The readings from the Proper of Time and Proper of Saints have been used for all Solemnities and Feasts since they must take the place of the weekday readings for those respective days. The readings from the weekday cycle generally are to be used even on days on which a Memorial or Optional Memorial of a Saint occurs. The exceptions to this rule are the Memorials or Optional Memorials which have “proper readings” (usually only the Gospel) assigned to them in the *Lectionary for Mass* and which must be used on those days. Substitutions from the Commons or Proper of Saints may be made for the other readings suggested for those Memorials or Optional Memorials. The Priest Celebrant, however, should not omit “too often or without sufficient cause the readings assigned for each day in the weekday Lectionary” (Introduction to the *Lectionary for Mass*, no. 83). In this Calendar, Optional Memorials are designated by the use of italics within brackets.

The Scripture citations and *Lectionary* numbers for all readings are from the *Lectionary for Mass for Use in the Dioceses of the United States of America*, second typical edition (1998/2001), and the *Lectionary for Mass Supplement* (2017), which is based on the *Ordo Lectionum Missæ, editio typica altera* (1981), as emended. The spellings of the names of Saints and Blesseds are from the *Roman Missal, Third Edition* (2011), based on the *Missale Romanum, editio typica tertia emendata* (2008).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES

1. Scripture citations are based on the *New American Bible* with the revised New Testament and may differ slightly from the citations given in the *Ordo Lectionum Missæ* (1981) due to difference in versification.
2. In the preparation of diocesan and provincial Calendars and *ordines*, the dedication of diocesan cathedrals, the dedication of parish churches, and special days of prayer (cf. *General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, no. 373) should be added, along with other commemorations of Saints and Blesseds which are included in those particular Calendars. More information is available in the *Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, particularly Chapter II.
3. “On Saturdays in Ordinary Time when no Obligatory Memorial occurs, an Optional Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary may be celebrated” (*Universal Norms on the Liturgical Year and the Calendar*, no. 15). This is indicated in the calendar by “BVM.” The readings and prayers may be selected from the Common of the Blessed Virgin Mary or Votive Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the *Roman Missal*, or in the *Collection of Masses of the Blessed Virgin Mary*.
4. In a decree dated March 23, 1992, the Bishop of Honolulu designated Christmas and the Immaculate Conception as the only two Holydays of Obligation for the State of Hawaii. This implements the indult received from the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments on May 26, 1990, and the subsequent *nihil obstat* from the National Conference of Catholic Bishops allowing Hawaii to legislate on this matter in accord with the policies of the Episcopal Conference of the Pacific (CEPAC).

5. This liturgical calendar has entries for Independence Day and Thanksgiving Day since they are inscribed in the Proper Calendar for the Dioceses of the United States of America, but it does not include other civic holidays commonly celebrated in this country (for example, Martin Luther King Jr. Day, Memorial Day, Labor Day, etc.). Respecting the liturgical norms (cf. GIRM, nos. 368-378), the *Roman Missal* offers appropriate Masses, but this calendar makes no suggestions for those holidays.
6. The 2028 liturgical year begins on the First Sunday of Advent, November 28, 2027. During the year 2028:
 - a. Sunday, December 12, 2027, is the Third Sunday of Advent, and the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe is omitted this year. Our Lady of Guadalupe may be appropriately honored in the Homily, Universal Prayer, and hymns during the Sunday liturgy. If pastoral advantage calls for it (cf. GIRM, no. 376), a Votive Mass of Our Lady of Guadalupe may be celebrated on a weekday before or after December 12, with the proper readings and prayers.
 - b. Saturday, January 1, is the Solemnity of Mary, the Holy Mother of God. In accord with the complementary norm to canon 1246 §2 confirmed for the dioceses of the United States of America, because it is a Saturday, this year the obligation to attend Mass on this date is abrogated.
 - c. Since Sunday, March 19, is the Third Sunday of Lent, the Solemnity of Saint Joseph, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary, is transferred to Monday, March 20.
 - d. Thursday, May 25, is the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord in the ecclesiastical provinces of Boston, Hartford, New York, Omaha, and Philadelphia. All other ecclesiastical provinces of the United States of America have transferred this Solemnity to the following Sunday, May 28; on Thursday, May 25, the Easter Weekday is observed in these provinces, or the Optional Memorial of Saint Bede the Venerable, Priest and Doctor of the Church, or of Saint Gregory VII, Pope, or of Saint Mary Magdalene de' Pazzi, Virgin.
 - e. In a notification of the Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments (March 24, 2018, Prot. n. 138/18), the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church takes precedence over another Obligatory Memorial that coincides with it. Thus, Monday, June 5 is the Memorial of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Church, and the Memorial of Saint Boniface, Bishop and Martyr, is omitted this year.

APPENDIX / APÉNDICE

For the benefit of those who prepare Spanish-language liturgical calendars and *ordines*, the following sections of the *Liturgical Calendar* are presented here in Spanish: Miscellaneous Notes, Proper Calendar for the Dioceses of the United States of America, and the titles of the liturgical days, as given in the U.S. edition of the *Misal Romano, Tercera Edición* (2018).

Para el beneficio de aquellos que preparan calendarios litúrgicos y ordines en español, las siguientes secciones del Liturgical Calendar se presentan aquí en español: Notas misceláneas, Calendario propio para las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América y los títulos de los días litúrgicos, según se ofrecen en la edición estadounidense del Misal Romano, Tercera Edición (2018).

NOTAS MISCELÁNEAS

1. Las citas bíblicas en inglés se basan en *New American Bible* con el Nuevo Testamento revisado y pueden diferir ligeramente de las citas dadas en el *Ordo Lectionum Missae* (1981) debido a diferencias en la versificación.
2. Al preparar los calendarios diocesanos y provinciales y *ordines*, deben añadirse la dedicación de las catedrales diocesanas, la dedicación de las iglesias parroquiales, los días especiales de oración (cfr. *Institución General del Misal Romano* [IGMR], n. 373), además de otras conmemoraciones de santos y beatos que se incluyen en esos calendarios particulares. Más información está disponible en las *Normas universales sobre el año litúrgico y sobre el calendario*, particularmente en el capítulo II.
3. “Los sábados del Tiempo Ordinario del año en los que no ocurra una memoria obligatoria se puede hacer memoria libre de la Virgen María” (*Normas universales sobre el año litúrgico y sobre el calendario*, n. 15). Esto es indicado en el calendario por medio de las siglas “BVM”. Las lecturas y oraciones pueden ser seleccionadas del Común de la Bienaventurada Virgen María o de las Misas votivas de la Bienaventurada Virgen María en el *Misal Romano*, o de las *Misas de la Virgen María*, vols. I y II.
4. En un decreto fechado el 23 de marzo de 1992, el obispo de Honolulu designó la Navidad y la Inmaculada Concepción como las dos únicas fiestas de precepto para el estado de Hawái. Esto implementa el indulto recibido el 26 de mayo de 1990 de la Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos, y del posterior *nihil obstat* de la Conferencia Nacional de Obispos Católicos permitiéndole a Hawái legislar sobre este asunto de acuerdo con las normas de la Conferencia Episcopal del Pacífico (CEPAC).

5. Este calendario litúrgico contiene entradas para el Día de la Independencia de los Estados Unidos y para el Día de Acción de Gracias, por estar inscritos en el Calendario propio para las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América; sin embargo, no incluye otros días cívicos festivos comúnmente celebrados en este país (por ejemplo, Día de Martin Luther King Jr., Día de los Caídos, Día del Trabajo, etc.). En conformidad con las normas litúrgicas (cfr. IGMR, nn. 368-378), el *Misal Romano* ofrece misas apropiadas, pero este calendario no propone recomendaciones para esas fiestas.
6. El año litúrgico 2028 comienza el primer domingo de Adviento, el 28 de noviembre de 2027. Durante el año 2028:
 - a. El domingo 12 de diciembre de 2027 es el tercer domingo de Adviento, y este año se omite la fiesta de la Bienaventurada Virgen María de Guadalupe. Se puede honrar apropiadamente a la Bienaventurada Virgen María de Guadalupe en la homilía, en la oración universal y en los himnos de la liturgia dominical. Si la utilidad pastoral lo pidiese (cfr. IGMR, n. 376), se puede celebrar una Misa votiva de la Bienaventurada Virgen María de Guadalupe en un día de la semana, antes o después del 12 de diciembre, con las lecturas y oraciones propias.
 - b. El sábado 1º de enero es la solemnidad de santa María, Madre de Dios. De acuerdo con la norma complementaria del canon 1246 §2 confirmada para las diócesis de los Estados Unidos de América, por ser sábado, este año se abroga la obligación de asistir a Misa en esa fecha.
 - c. Por ser el domingo 19 de marzo el tercer domingo de Cuaresma, la solemnidad de san José, esposo de la Bienaventurada Virgen María, se traslada al lunes 20 de marzo.
 - d. El jueves 25 de mayo es la solemnidad de la Ascensión del Señor en las provincias eclesiásticas de Boston, Hartford, Nueva York, Omaha y Filadelfia. Todas las demás provincias eclesiásticas de los Estados Unidos de América han trasladado esta solemnidad al domingo siguiente, el 28 de mayo; el jueves 25 de mayo se observa, en esas provincias, el día de la semana de Pascua, o bien la memoria libre de san Beda el Venerable, presbítero y doctor de la Iglesia, o de san Gregorio VII, Papa, o de santa María Magdalena de Pazzi, virgen.
 - e. En una notificación de la Congregación para el Culto Divino y la Disciplina de los Sacramentos (24 de marzo de 2018, Prot. n. 138/18), la memoria de la Bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia tiene mayor precedencia sobre otra memoria obligatoria que la coincida. Por lo tanto, el lunes 5 de junio es la memoria de la Bienaventurada Virgen María, Madre de la Iglesia, y este año se omite la memoria de san Bonifacio, obispo y mártir.
