## Meet the Presenter: Fr. Quinn R. Conners, O.Carm., PhD

Fr. Quinn R. Conners, O.Carm., PhD, is a Carmelite of the PCM (Chicago) Province and a licensed clinical psychologist. He recently returned to Brandsma Priory as the Co-Director of Novices. Previously he served his province as the Prior and Director of Formation at Whitefr-

iars Hall in Washington, DC (1983-90, 2007-12, 2016-21), Director of Novices (2004-07), and Provincial (1990-96). He was part of the clinical staff at Saint Luke Institute (1997-2004) and served as an Associate Director of Clinical Services (2012-17). He holds a doctorate in Clinical Psychology from Fuller Theological Seminary and is an adjunct faculty member at The Catholic University of America. He has also served as principal of Mt. Carmel High School in Los Angeles and as a psychotherapist, spiritual director, and part-time faculty member at Washington Theological Union. Fr. Conners has presented workshops nationally and internationally in the areas of psychology and spirituality, sexuality, vocational discernment, and issues in the first five years of ministry.
