

The Federation of Vietnamese Catholics in the USA announces its priests' convocation of 2022. The Emmaus IX Convocation will take place in the Diocese of Dallas from October 17 to 20, 2022 at the Church of Our Lady of Perpetual Help, 2121 W. Apollo Rd., Garland, Texas. 




Encountering Christ in Harmony: A Pastoral Response to Our Asian and Pacific Island Brothers and Sisters (Product Code 7-576)




