He is the lead author of the recently self-published book, "Encounter Christ: Growing in the Heart and Habits of Discipleship." Rich is the concept designer and content writer of the Bluemound Graphics yearly parish evangelization calendar. In collaboration with Catholic recording artist, Anna Nuzzo, he leads the Encounter Jesus Band in concert events of prayer, praise, Scripture, and song. Rich is a popular speaker, retreat facilitator, and mission leader. Rich has worked as a full-time lay ecclesial minister, in a variety of pastoral roles, for the past 36 years. Rich lives with Georgia, his wife of 35 years, in Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin. They are members of St. Dominic Parish, Brookfield, Wisconsin.

Ann Lankford, Director of the Office for Catechesis and Evangelization of Diocese of La Crosse. She is the co-author with Joe Paprocki of the book "The Catechist's Backpack-Spirittual Essentials for the Journey" by Loyola Press and blogs monthly for the website "The Catechist's Journey". She is happily married to Wayne and they have three children, two sons and a daughter.

Xia Vue Yang, President and Chief Executive Officer of HMOS Corporation.

Xia Vue holds a Master Degree in Chemical Engineering from Institute National des Sciences Appliqués de Lyon in France. He was a Senior Project Engineer at Pentair Water Treatment Company. Xia Vue is cofounder of the Hmong Mutual Assistance Association of Sheboygan and served on its board of director from 1981 to 1991. He served two consecutive terms as president of the Wisconsin United Coalition of Mutual Assistance Associations, Inc. from 1991 to 1995. During these 15 years of community services, Xia Vue has taught organizational, leadership, cultural and management skills to many of the Wisconsin MAAS. He is the co-founder and serves as chairman of the Lao, Hmong and American Veteran Memorial located in Deland Park, Sheboygan. The memorial was dedicated in 2006. Xia Vue served also two-terms as president of Hmong American National Catholic Association (HANCA), a religious organization with membership all over in the United States of American. He was a Paul Harris Fellow of Rotary International, a 2009 Vatican II award recipient, and member of St. Peter Claver Catholic Church of Sheboygan since 1981. He is married to Pa and they have four children, two daughters-in-laws and six grand-children.

Adult's Sessions summary

Session 1: The New Evangelization: Fostering a Culture of Missionary Discipleship. Disciple-making doesn't just happen because a church exists and people show up. Forming disciples implies intentionality and process, an invitation into a life giving relationship with Christ. Pope Francis asks us to form and send out "missionary disciples" from our ministries. What does this mean? In our parishes, we often meet adults at the most joyful and hope-filled moments of their life – when they get engaged, are married, at baptism and when they seek out faith formation for their children. We also encounter parishioners at moments of intense struggle and pain – through death, brokenness and moments of questioning. What does it take to move adults and particularly young adults from apathy and complacency to vibrancy and engagement? How can we intentionally form disciples who are "on fire" for Christ? This workshop will give participants practical and effective ways to encounter, form and send out missionary disciples to change the world.

Session 2: Making Christ Known and Loved: The Key Components of Being Spirit-filled Evangelizers. We are called to be people who know and love the Person of Jesus Christ and communicate with joy our relationship with Christ to others. In this interactive session, participants will experience the Church's tradition of praying with Scripture and hear a simple presentation of the message of the Gospel. These two components have central and irreplaceable roles in the New Evangelization.

Session 3: The New Evangelization: Practical Strategies for Making and Duplicating Disciples. Jesus gave his Church clear missionary marching orders when he said, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations..." (Matthew 28: 19-20). He sent the Church to do what he did: reach, call, and form disciples so they can be sent to go and make new disciples. This workshop will explore the four-part mission of the Church and provide practical strategies for making and duplicating disciples in our relationships and parishes.

Session 4: There are three concurrent breakout sessions (Diocese of Green Bay, Diocese of La Crosse and Archdiocese of Milwaukee). These sessions are specifically designed to provide opportunities for the Hmong Catholic community leaders and their diocesan Director of New Evangelization to come together in a more personal setting and share ideas and tools of implementation of New Evangelization within their Hmong communities.

Session 5: Honoring the Ancestors of the Catholic Faith in Laos (Hawm txog tsoom poj yawm txwv koob Kav Tos Liv Los Tsuas).

The Beatification of the 17 Martyrs in Laos will be celebrating in June 17, 2017 at the National Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows, in the vicinity of St. Louis, Missouri. There is a Hmong Catechist, Paul Thor Xiong and he will be the first Hmong that will be honored.
