Re: The Convocation of Catholic Leaders: The Joy of the Gospel in America

Orlando, Florida, July 1-4, 2017

As you may know, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) will convene an unprecedented gathering of key leaders from dioceses and Catholic organizations from all across the country next summer in order to assess the challenges and opportunities of our time, particularly in the context of the Church in the United States. The gathering will assemble participants for a

strategic conversation, under the leadership of the bishops, on forming missionary disciples to animate the Church and to engage the culture. Here are some details:

- The Convocation of Catholic Leaders: The Joy of the Gospel in America will be held at the Hyatt Regency across from the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando, Florida, from Saturday, July 1, to Tuesday, July 4, 2017.
- Inspired by *Evangelii Gaudium*, the Convocation will form leaders who will be equipped and re-energized to share the Gospel as missionary disciples, in their particular roles, while offering fresh insights informed by new research, communications strategies, and successful models.
- This is an invitation-only event. Most leaders will be attending as diocesan delegations with their bishops. Others will be attending as leaders, identified by the USCCB, from Catholic organizations, movements and apostolates, missions, religious institutes, agencies and institutions. A helpful brochure, providing more detail, is attached.
- If you are interested in participating in this historic gathering, it would be helpful to communicate soon with your bishop your desire to be considered, while understanding that the size and membership of diocesan delegations are at the discretion of each bishop. He has also been asked to appoint an official liaison to the Convocation, who will coordinate registering the diocesan team.
- Each diocese will be responsible for covering the travel, lodging, and an average \$450 perperson registration fee (covering a number of meals) for the members of their delegation. Very affordable rates have been negotiated with the five hotels hosting the Convocation.
- Already, \$400,000 in scholarships has been pledged to help defray costs for dioceses in need, who would otherwise not be able to send a delegation.
- Since not every diocesan or parish leader will be able to participate in the Convocation onsite, we hope to stream important addresses and liturgies. More information will continue to be posted at www.usccb.org/convocation/.

The most exciting element of the Convocation, though, isn't what happens in Orlando next July; rather, it is what happens beyond that gathering. When diocesan delegations return home, they will bring both the tools and the spirit to influence parish and diocesan communities, forming a Church of the *missionary option* that goes to the peripheries, as envisioned by Pope Francis. We encourage your participation in this historic Convocation (at the discretion of your bishop, of course).
