


CCLV Vocation Survey Results

- Youth involvement in Church is critical for vocations;
- Consistent underrepresentation of Hispanic/Latinos and strong presence of Asians in Religious & Priesthood classes.
- College debt a growing factor
 - 26% of newly ordained affected / \$23,000
 - 7% of newly professed / \$16,000

CCLV Vocation Survey Results

- Encouragement is a critical factor
 - 1 encourager | twice as likely
 - 3 encouragers | five times as likely
- Deacon Encouragers
 - Profession Class of 2014: 6%
 - Ordination Class of 2015: 10%

- Deacons 2005: 15,763 | 2012: 18,497 (3%↑ per year)
- Priests 2005: 42,500 | 2012: 39,000 (1%↓ per year)




- Select Demographics
 - 18,725 (15, 191 active)
 - 81% active; 15% retired; 2% inactive; 1% suspended;
 1% leave of absence
 - 93% married; 4% widowed; 2%never-married; <1% divorced; <1% remarried

 - 94% are 50 or older; 42% are 60 or older; 28% are 70 or older
 - 60% have a college degree; 11% graduate degree in theology/ministry

National Directory


- Recognitio expired October 2014
- In 2013 CCLV conducted a formal consultation on the National Directory
 - NADD, September 2013
 - Bishops, November 2013
 - Canonical Affairs & Church Governance Committee,
 December 2013
- Simple renewal of recognitio without any changes for another 5-years granted

National Directory, 2nd Edition

- Planning for drafting a 2nd edition will begin in June 2015
- Drafting process could begin as soon as fall 2015
