### Response to King's "Letter from Birmingham Jail"

On the 50th anniversary of Dr. King's famous letter, Christian leaders gathered in Birmingham, AL to present a formal response to his daughter Dr. Bernice King.

USCCB Vice President Archbishop Kurtz delivered remarks in response to speeches by Representative John Lewis and Sojourners President Jim Wallis. The event was sponsored by Christian Churches Together.

## Emerging Trends in Ecumenism Dinner

Last month, with St. Paul's College and the Washington Theological Consortium, SEIA co-sponsored an ecumenical dinner, prayer service and seminar that was open to the public. The event drew more than 50 local ecumenists who listened to keynote speeches by Fr. John Crossin, OSFS, our executive director, and Dr. Katherine Grieb.

Two discussion groups focused on key dialogue topics with our Reformed and Orthodox partners. Another entered into the themes and practices of spiritual ecumenism and a fourth dealt with Evangelical-Catholic networks.
