

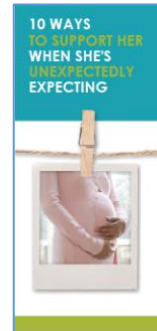

Advent

The season of Advent is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to preparing for the celebration of the Lord's birth on Christmas and for Christ's second coming at the end of time. Patronal feast day of the United States of America (December 8, 2020)



On December 8, the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin. (While normally a holy day of obligation, most dioceses continue to dispense the faithful from the obligation to attend Mass during the pandemic.) On this feast, we celebrate Mary's conception free from the stain of Original Sin, and we recognize that Mary's life began at the moment she was conceived in the womb of St. Anne. So, too, does every human life begin at the moment of conception, when it is lovingly knit together by God the Father.

The Immaculate Conception is sometimes confused with the Annunciation. This [bulletin insert](#) can be used to help differentiate these two important celebrations. On this Solemnity, consider praying Pope Francis' [Prayer for the Immaculate Conception](#): "We are in need of your immaculate gaze, to rediscover the ability to look upon persons and things with respect and awareness." You can also offer this [prayer for religious liberty](#), which seeks, on the front of the [prayer card](#), the intercession of Mary Immaculate.

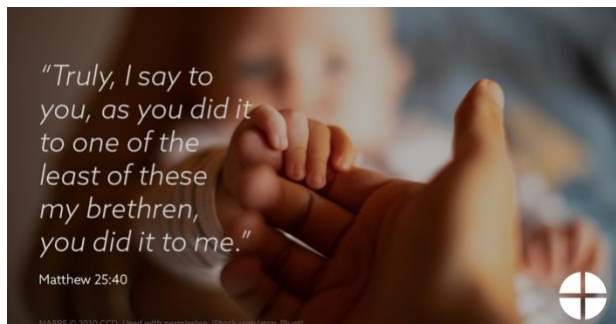

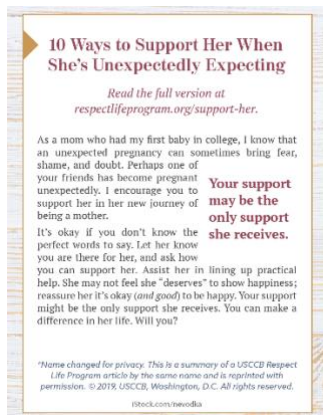

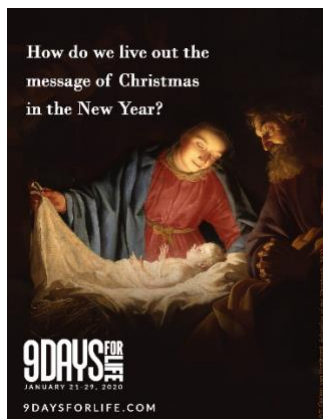
