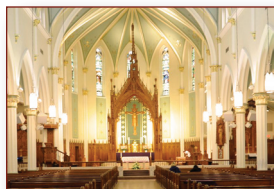
Fr. Michael Sherwin, O.P.

St. Louis Bertrand Church

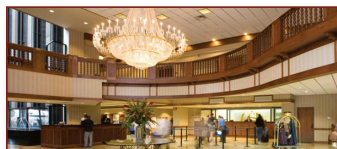
