



# WORKING ON THE MARGINS

CATHOLIC CAMPAIGN FOR HUMAN DEVELOPMENT

Dear Pastor/Parish Administrator,

For more than 50 years, the Catholic Campaign for Human Development (CCHD) has helped low-income people address the root causes of poverty and injustice, not through a “one-size-fits-all” approach, but by funding local organizations that empower low-income people to make positive impacts in their own communities. This grassroots model allows people to use their experiences and knowledge of their communities to build coalitions of faith leaders, local businesses, and other neighbors that work together to find solutions that benefit everyone.

With CCHD funding, the Community Lighthouse program, developed by Together New Orleans, has transformed churches and other neighborhood institutions into solar-powered facilities where people can shelter when natural disasters such as hurricanes cause power outages. In 2023, Together New Orleans expanded its project to nine facilities, and it garnered recognition—and project funding—from the mayor’s office and the US Congress to expand the program even further. In addition, the organization implemented solar power training programs at the Community Lighthouses while working with local government to reform regulations, thereby making solar power more available to low- and middle-income residents.

This record of success shows how your support for CCHD makes a positive impact in vulnerable, underresourced

communities. When you give to the CCHD collection, 25% of your contribution stays within your own diocese, so you help your own community build on this legacy of success while also helping communities across the country.

## SIMPLE STEPS

1. **ANNOUNCE** the collection in your parish, using the bulletin announcements and parish appeal provided, so your parishioners know what it is, when to expect it, and why they should support it. **This is the best way to ensure the success of the collection.**
2. **PREACH** about the realities of poverty in the United States and the importance of standing in solidarity with those on the margins. The Eucharist, celebrated as a community, teaches us about human dignity and calls us into right relationship with God, ourselves, and others. As the Body of Christ, the Eucharist sends us on a mission to transform our communities, neighborhoods, and world.
3. **PRAY** for the intercession of Our Lady of Guadalupe in support of justice, so that those living in poverty will be comforted and lifted up, and so that they will find lasting opportunities to preserve their human dignity through meaningful work.

For our Holy Father, Pope Francis, our bishop, N., and all Church leaders, that they will continue to proclaim Christ's love and compassion for the poor as they educate the Church about the need to work for justice in our world, let us pray to the Lord. **R/**.
