Since 2001, the De La Salle Blackfeet School in Browning, Montana, has provided a quality Catholic education to the children living on the Blackfeet (Pikuni) Indian Reservation. There, students not only learn critical skills such as reading, writing, and math but also cultivate a deeper understanding of their Catholic faith and their cultural heritage through Blackfeet studies classes. In response to the high rate of poverty in the community, the school relies on volunteer teachers and donations to keep the school accessible to members of the community, regardless of their economic status.

Due to its unique circumstances and special arrangement with the Diocese of Helena, De La Salle Blackfeet School prepares its eighth-grade students for the Sacrament of Confirmation with its own religious education program. With support from Catholic Home Missions, the school can purchase workbooks, pay salaries for religion teachers who extend their service beyond a one- to two-year volunteer period, and establish a prayer and reflection group for school staff.
