Solemnity of the Annunciation of the Lord: March 25, 2022



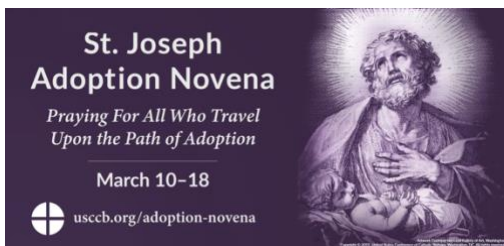

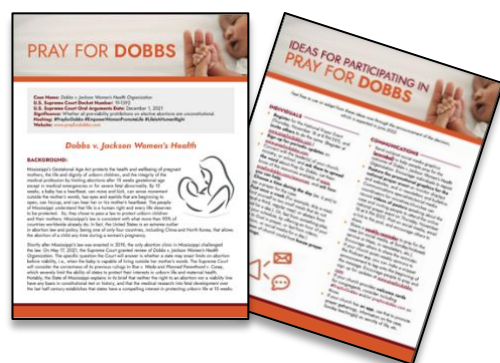
St. Joseph Adoption Novena: March 10–18

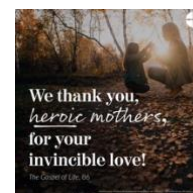

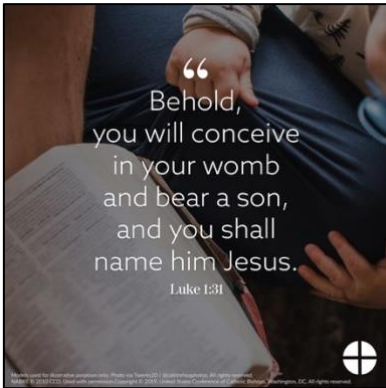

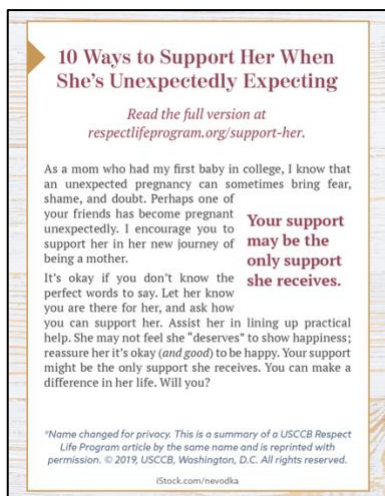
