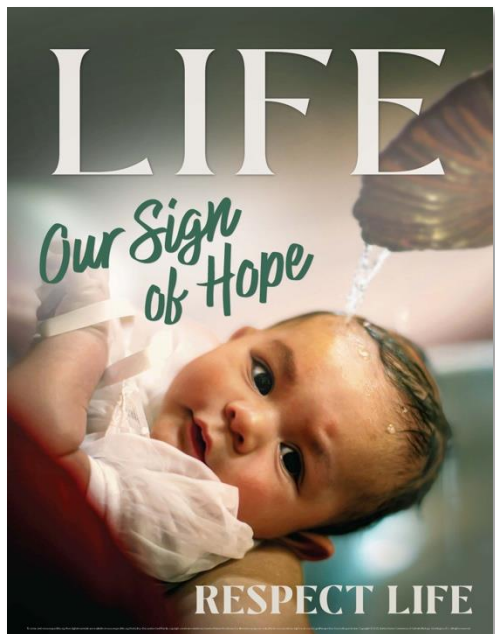

in Ordinary Time**

October 26th

May the Lord help us to understand more deeply
the challenges of pregnant and parenting moms
and to respond with increased care and support;

**Thirtieth Sunday
in Ordinary Time**

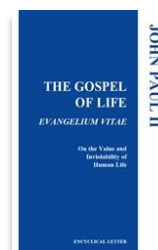
